Men's basketball team wins 5th straight Team improves record to 11-5

sports editor The Penn State - Behrend men's basketball team completed a very successful week, as they used hot shooting and tough defense to win their fifth straight game, and improve their overall record to 11 - 5.

The Lions also moved their AMCC record to 4-1.

Last night, the Lions handed LaRoche a 90 - 67 beatdown before a very enthusiastic crowd at Erie

Hall. "We came out, played hard, and just got things rolling," said Emick after the game. "We took them out of their game plan, and shot the ball really well," added Emick.

Jason Paloskey and Ashley Orris each had huge games, as they led the team with 23 and 21 points apiece.

The two also combined for 10 of the teams 13 three - pointers, as Paloskey was 6 of 7 from behind the arch, and Orris 4 of 7.

Brian Emick chipped in 12 points and 2 steals, while snagging 5 rebounds.

Paloskey also came away with 5 boards of his own.

"Everyone played really well," said sophomore Nate Wilson after the

Playing without two starters, the Lions used hot shooting by both Brian Emick and Ashlev Orris to knock off SUNY- Fredonia at home by a score of 76 - 67 on January 22.

The win avenges a 56 - 51 loss to Fredonia earlier in the year.

Junior Brian Emick equaled his career game high in points by netting 23, while also pulling down a gamehigh 11 rebounds.

Also contributing big to the win for the Lions was freshman Ashley Orris, who knocked in 17 points and dished out 5 assists in only his second start of the season.

Emick and Orris both had a huge second half, as they combined to score 29 of the team's final 42 points of the game.

Emick banged 5 of 6 three-pointers, while Orris threw in 4 of 12 from behind the arc. The two also had very solid performances from the freethrow line, as Emick made 6 of 6, and Orris put threw 3 of 3.

The Lions were a solid 22 of 27

while also shooting 21 of 51 from the field.

The Lions next traveled to Pitt-Greensburg on January 24 where they pulled off a tough 83 - 80 vic-

"We came out really strong," said junior forward Brian Emick. "We were able to hold them off down the stretch," he added.

Brock Boyaird led the offensive attack with 20 points, while Ashley Orris chipped in with 16. Jason Paloskey, Brian Emick, and Steve Hout each contributed with 15 points

Next up for the Lions was a big game against AMCC foe Frostburg State. The win moved the overall record for Behrend to 9-5, while also moving ahead in the AMCC to 3-1.

On the 25th of January, the Lions handed Frostburg State a defeat for the second straight time this year by a score of 72 - 56.

> The Lions once again had a great day at the free- throw line to finish the game with a 14 of 17 mark.


> The Lions used a 15 - 0 run to close off the first half, and erase a 14 point first half deficit they had fallen into
