09/19/98 Observed three skateboarders in front of Porcupine Hall. Explained the policy prohibiting skateboards on University property. Names added to the list of those warned.

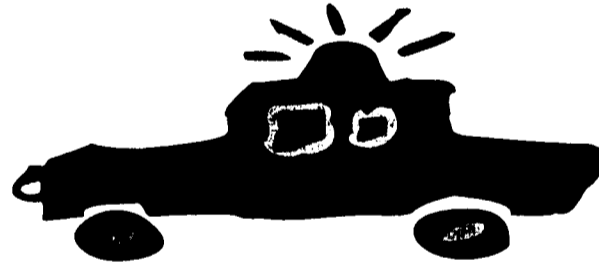
