### Reber named to new position

"I am really pleased that Chris has taken this new position," said Dr. John Lilley, provost and dean. Dr. Chris Reber has been named associate provost for Advancement and University Relations at Behrend. In this position his duties will be to oversee all activities of the Office of Development and University Relations including the up-coming capital campaign. "This is a critical moment in our development as a college, and the upcoming capital campaign is key to our future success. I'm delighted that the University has chosen him," added Lilley. Lilley commented that Reber brings immense organizational skills and people skills to the task at hand.

Lilley also noted that the change in title from director of Development and University Relations to associate provost for Advancement and University Relations will signal the importance of this role that Reber has taken to the people in the community. Chris Reber has had a long history

with Behrend to date, beginning as assistant dean of Student Affairs from 1981 to 1984. After receiving his Ph.D. at the University of Pittsburgh, he returned to Behrend in 1987 when he was named Dean of Student Affairs. He held that position until last April, when he agreed to serve as interim director of Development and University Relations.

### Behrend gets new marketing major

The School of Business and the School of Science at Penn State Erie each had several changes in their respective departments. The Board of Trustees approved a marketing major and minor for the School of Business and modifications to the physics major in the School of Science. Dr. Saad Andaleeb, associate professor of marketing said, "The marketing major helps to fill out our options for the study of business." Marketing courses are generally well responded to by stu-

dents, this major allows business students to link principles taught in class with that of the real world, making it a beneficial addition to the School of Business. "There will be an increase in service-sector jobs in the coming decade, so the focus of this new major will be marketing in a service economy," said Andaleeb.

Two divisions will be included in the physics major; general physics and computational physics. Dr. Bill Baxter, associate professor of physics noted, "After consideration of where many of our physics majors were going with their careers, we determined that an option in applied physics would be helpful to them." This option would be advantageous to physic majors entering the field after graduation. "These two options will continue to have basic core courses, but the computational physics option will require more hands-on computer and electronics experience" said Baxter

**09/29/98** Complainant reported that his Ford Bronco had been stolen from U-Lot. Info entered into national crime computer.


**09/29/98** On duty RA called and needed assistance with what she called suspicious behavior. Before I arrived she called and said they handled everything and my presence was not needed.
