Sports SPRING SPORTS PREVIEW Behrend baseball hopes to Track and hustle to top of AMCC



The Behrend Lions baseball team enters the 1999 season with hopes of continuing to build on a program that is on the rise. The Lions are coming off their winningest season in the history of the college with a 23-10 record. The Behrend men hope to compete for the Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference championship in only their second season in the conference.

The Lions are coached by Paul Benim, who is entering his fourth season as the head coach of the baseball team. In his first three seasons, Benim has put together a talented team that could vie for the AMCC championship. Benim is assisted by Matt Palisin and Marc Burchanowski.

The Lions enter this season on a high note, winning twelve of their last fourteen games and are riding a six game winning streak. The 1998 team broke records in pitching strike outs (240), runs scored (263), batting average (.332), RBI's (227), stolen bases (120, ranked nationally), and single game records in runs (20) and stolen bases (11). Behrend enters the 1999 season behind the leadership of senior Ryan

Smith. Smith comes off a 1998 season that saw him bat .312 with 41 runs and



recorded a 4-1 record and a 1.37 ERA. The Lions will also get leadership from their five juniors. Jeremy Brubaker, Ryan Frederick, Shaun Headley, Corey Walters, and Dave Williams add

experience to a relatively young team. Coach Benim commented on the veterens saying, "Those six guys are going to be a major factor. They've been there, they know what's expected.

They know what to do. We've got good leadership with those guys." The Lions' roster consists of four sophomores and sixteen freshmen. Behrend's

pitching staff will consist of Ryan Frederick, coming off a 1998 season that saw him strike out 55 batters in 48 2/3 innings. Supporting Frederick will be Smith, Ryan Shaun Headley. Corey Walters,

> The Lions will open their season with a spring training trip to Florida from March 7-14. In last season's trip, Behrend won five of seven in

preparation for the season. Speaking on the importance of the trip, Benim realizes the value of good southern weather and said, "We've got some good teams we will be playing down there." He added, "The main thing is to prepare for the northern schedule, try to evaluate people and give people and oppontunity."

After the trip, the Lions will open their regular season schedule hosting Allegheny College on March 18, at 1:00 p.m. "March is going to be a great test," said Benim. AMCC play will begin on April 6, as the Lions will host Pitt-Greensburg. The AMCC tournament will be on April 24-25, followed by the ECAC Championships on May 8 if the Lions are to qualify.

In the AMCC conference, the Behrend men see Frostburg State as their toughest opponent. The Lions know an AMCC Championship win must go through Frostburg.

Behrend's annual goal is simple in words, but challenging in action. "We want to be Allegheny Mountain **Collegiate Conference Champions!** We want to be the most hustling team in NCAA Division III Baseball!

This spring marks the inaugural season for Track & Field as an official varsity sport at Behrend. The program has been well received, and currently there are



season and coached a 16-19 overall season her first year as coach last season.


