The Behrend men compiled 13 points on the meet and were only five points behind Division III powerhouse Carnegie Mellon. Many Behrend men posted impressive performances in the school's first competitive meet.

Freshman jumper Scott Nicklas finished in second place overall in the triple jump, clearing 43'2", and the long jump at 21'. Chad Smith finished in fourth place in the triple jump. Nicklas and Smith teamed with Kris Ivie to win the team competition in the triple jump. Nicklas,
