


Matt Livingston, 02 MIS, was


named to the AMCC All- Conference Team. When asked how he felt about being named to the All- Conference

The Behrend men's and women's track and field teams competed at the Slippery Rock Open on April 17 under cold and rainy conditions. This meet came off an overwhelming week where the men learned of their national ranking of
