Controversial Stadium Expansion at University Park

In March, Penn State President Graham Spanier spent some time in the capital petitioning the Pennsylvania House and Senate Appropriations Committees for funding. Every year, the state government allocates money to colleges throughout Pennsylvania for things like updating technology and improving the standard of living on campus. This year, however, included in Spanier's requests was a proposition for \$15 million separate from the money allocated for use within the university. The proposed \$15 million would instead fund, in part, the \$85 million expansion of Beaver stadium at University Park. However, some students think the money could be better

In May of 1998, the Penn State Board of Trustees approved the Beaver Stadium expansion to include 10,000 more seats as well as the addition of skyboxes. UP Athletic Director, Tim Curley said that no tuition money would be used in order to carry out the project. In keeping with that, university officials are looking to the State for help. The expansion, according to Spanier, falls under the umbrella of community service projects, which are intended to boost local economies. The State will disburse \$650 million for community service projects this year, half of which will be used to build new major league football and baseball stadiums.


Critics say the money could be better used at UP, and that the project could be funded through the purchase of skybox tickets since the demand for tickets is so high at this point. But Spanier hopes the project will bring about a growth spurt for Center County.

Pat Groner, 08 BECON, took the side of most Penn State students, saying, "I disapprove. I think it's a waste of money and adding 10,000 seats and sky boxes to Beaver Stadium will take

away from the allure of the place. Crowding 100,000 people in there for a football game is half the fun. I definitely think the money could be better used for other purposes."

Mark Schoneveld, a History major at UP and columnist for The Collegian wrote an editorial in the March 17 issue condemning Spanier's request. He said, "adding 10,000 seats to Beaver stadium is borderline chauvinism and self-glorification. While we're at it, why don't we pave the entire grass fields around Beaver Stadium so that tailgaters won't have to deal with mud."

It seems that although Spanier has tried to shed the project in a favorable light, most students are opposed to the idea. With the rapid growth of Penn State becoming a concern for more and more students, university officials will have to work carefully to change minds about the stadium expansion.
