Behrend Athletics had a year to remember in its 1998-99 schedule. Many Lions' teams set new school records with four teams capturing the Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference (AMCC) Championship. Some teams earned regional rankings while the college added another Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference to its trophy

The spring season saw both the men's and women's soccer teams excel under the direction of head coach Dan Perritano.

THE MEN'S SOCCER TEAM won a school record, 13 wins in a year that saw them earn an NCAA Division III, North East Regional Poll ranking for the third consecutive season.
