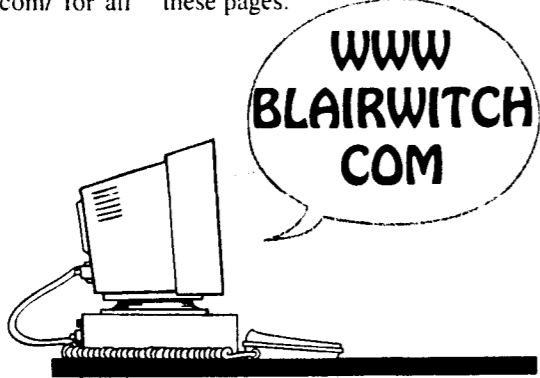
the eerie details, frightening facts and inside info that you crave.
