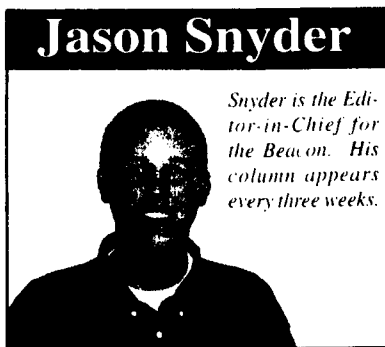


Out of Bounds
