
The View From Here For Pete's sake! Let him in!

In 1989 one of baseball's all-time greats was banned from baseball for life. Ten years later, Pete Rose is still trying to get his way back into Major League Baseball and furthermore into the Hall of Fame. In August of '89, Rose agreed to a lifetime ban for gambling. The ban means that he is ineligible to be inducted into the Hall of Fame, which he righfully deserves. The settlement he signed did not conclude whether or not he did actually gamble on baseball. Part of the settlement included that he could apply for reinstatement the following year. The commissioner at the time of the signing of the agreement, A. Bartlett Giamatti, died before the year waiting period was up. During Giamatti's service as commissioner, he never resolved the matter of whether Rose engaged in sports gambling at all. Major



League Baseball stuck with the commissioner's decision and did not overrule the lifetime ban on Rose.

Commisioner Giamatti had bad blood with Rose the year prior to his ban. During the 1988 season, while Rose was the manager of the Reds, he bumped an umpire arguing a call. Giamatti immediately suspended him for thirty days. The commissioner received many complaints and protests that the punishment was much too severe. Despite all this, he re-

fused to reverse his decision.

Rose has now been given the oppurtunity to state his position and defend himself. Statistics show that his support from the fans has nearly doubled since '89. Many believe that he didn't gamble on his team. Although Rose has admitted that he gambled, it was only on football. If gambling is a crime then everyone who goes to casinos or even plays the lottery if just as guilty. As long as he didn't bet against his own team he didn't affect the results of the outcome. Even if he did bet in favor of his own team, which he denies ever doing, what is wrong with that?

It is absurd to keep such a great player out of the Hall. Rose is the alltime career hits leader with 4,256; he also leads the Major League with 14,053 at-bats and 3,562 games. His awards include two gold gloves in left field and he won the National League

Without effort I could think of many players in major sports that are far worse than Pete Rose that are still playing the game or are in the Hall of Fame. Let's see the list includes drug addicts,



convicts, point shavers and even murderers (ahhOJchoo). God bless their souls. Gambling is not the worst thing in the world. Hell, it's legal.

Rose took his case to the internet to ask fans to sign his petition for reinstatement. Major League Baseball commissioner Bud Selig has agreed to hear Rose's case. If he in fact is reinstated, he will most likely be elected into the Hall of Fame. If he isn't reinstated, one of the premier players of baseball will be missing from the hallowed halls of Cooperstown. Rose has stated, "The only reason I want to get back is to be on the field (managing). A Cooperstown plaque would be nice, but that's not my objective in life. That means more to my two kids." Rose himself doesn't show much concern of getting the recognition he deserves, but it would mean a lot to his fans. Over twenty pieces of Rose's memorabilia are currently displayed in the Hall of Fame, if it's good enough for the bats: and balls he played with, why isn't it good enough for him?
