

Unselfish Lakers? Must be Zen Buddhist Phil

The faces are the same. The expectations are still to win a championship. And the spoiled Los Angeles Lakers still have their big-headed superstars with egos the size of Shaq's shoes and Kobe's still-growing afro. But there's one difference; the philosophical tactics of the Zenguru Phil Jackson has L.A. on their way to their first championship since 1988.

It's always been a theory that great coaches are the ones that can come up with an offense that best fits the players that they have. Mavericks coach Don Nelson has always been unsuccessful trying to take his offensive game plan from city to city, while Rockets coach Rudy Tomianovich still tries to run his slow half-court offense despite the quick Jason Snyder

in NBA history.


Jackson joined the Lakers after a year away from the game and is fueled up for another run at a dynasty with a very talented, but selfish, team. Or at least they were selfish. You know that if Jackson could tame the pierced, tattooed and trouble-plagued Dennis Rodman, he could convince O'Neal and Bryant that they weren't as good as they thought they were.

The only problem for the rest of the league is that O'Neal has grown a liking to the triangle, and is quickly turning into that dangerous player that he has always considered himself to be. O'Neal is the heavy favorite for the league MVP award, currently second in the league in scoring (28.5 ppg), second in rebounding (14.3 rpg) and first in field goal percentage (.569). The problem? The man got Shaq to read a book, Kobe to pass the ball, and the egocentric Lakers to run an actual offense. What's next? 
