SPRING CONCERTS

The choir and concert band at Penn State Erie, The Behrend College, will present spring concert performances Tuesday, April 18. The joint performance is open to the public and will take place in the Reed Union Building Commons at 8 p.m.

The Behrend Concert Band, directed by Dr. Gary Viebranz, lecturer in music, will present the works of Aaron Copland, including his well-known *Fanfare for the Common Man*. This tribute to Copland will coincide with the 100th anniversary of his birth.

The Behrend College Choir will also perform on April 18. Directed by Dr. Daniel Barnard, also a lecturer in music, the choir will join with the St. Paul Episcopal Church Choir to present the polyphonic mass *O Magnum Mysterium*. First published in 1592 in Spain, the mass is one of twenty olyphonic masses composed by Tomas Luis de

polyphonic masses composed by Tomas Luis de Victoria, who is considered to be one of the choral masters of the Renaissance.

The two choirs will also give a repeat performance.





TAKE BACK THE NIGHT 2000

Penn State Behrend will host Take Back the Night 2000 on Wednesday, April 26. Participants are asked to meet in the Reed Wintergarden at 7 p.m. for an introductory talk, and the candlelit walk will begin at 7:30 p.m.

Take Back the Night is an annual call to make the night safe for Women. It focuses primarily on promoting awareness for rape and sexual assault. The first local Take Back the Night March took place at Penn State Behrend in the 1980's and in succeeding years was co-sponsored with other organizations and relocated to downtown Erie.

This year, the students involved in Women Today have decided to re-ignite interest in this important event by sponsoring the march at Behrend. The candlelit walk through campus will include brief talks concerning issues such as date rape, counseling, and legal recourse for rape survivors. The event will conclude with a speak-out, when any person is invited to share her or his experience with rape or sexual assault. Counselors from Behrend will be participating in the march and will be available to talk to anyone present. Following the march will be a reception in the Reed Wintergarden.

COMMENCEMENT

Dr. Ursula Davis, assistant professor of communications, will be the commencement speaker.

Immediately following the program, a reception will be held in the Reed Building/Reed lawn to honor graduates, guests, faculty, and staff.
