
Don't Get Me Started

Video replay clearly showed that Bret Hull's skate was in the goal crease, a violation of the rules that should result in the waiving off of the goal. But replay never was used and the goal stood, as the Sabres felt the opportunity to claim Lord Stanley's cup slip

After a disappointing regular season and a backdoor entrance into the playoffs, the Sabres hoped to forget the heist of last season's Stanley Cup.

But the crimes against the Sabres continue. During game two of this year's rendition of the Stanley Cup finals, the Sabres were slapped with another refereeing miscue that cost them the game.

In contrast to Hull's goal last year. which actually went into the net, the goal scored by the Flyers' John LeClair during game two went through the side of the net. LeClair's goal should have been called off because it never went in the goal. A key component of scoring a goal is to actually get the puck in the front of the net. Apparently in the eyes of the NHL and its crack staff of referees,


