St. Louis Rams deserve respect...now

It took the St. Louis Rams until the Super Bowl last year to finally gain some respect among NFL fans, and there wouldn't be much of a surprise if it happened again this year.

Paging through preview magazine after preview magazine before the season started, it was apparent that teams like Tampa Bay, Washington and even Detroit had taken over as the NFC's perceived powerhouses, with teams like Dallas, Green Bay and Denver still getting some respect in the way they are expected to finish the season.

The answer? We hate not knowing who's going to win, how


much they're going to win by, and how often they are going to do it. All sports fans are
