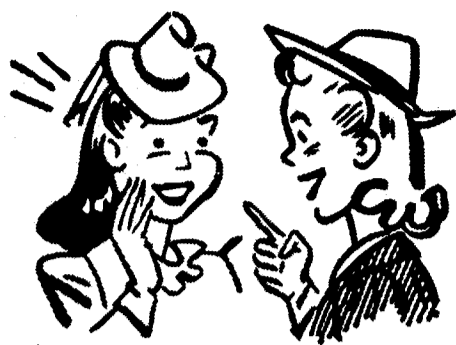


Time Management

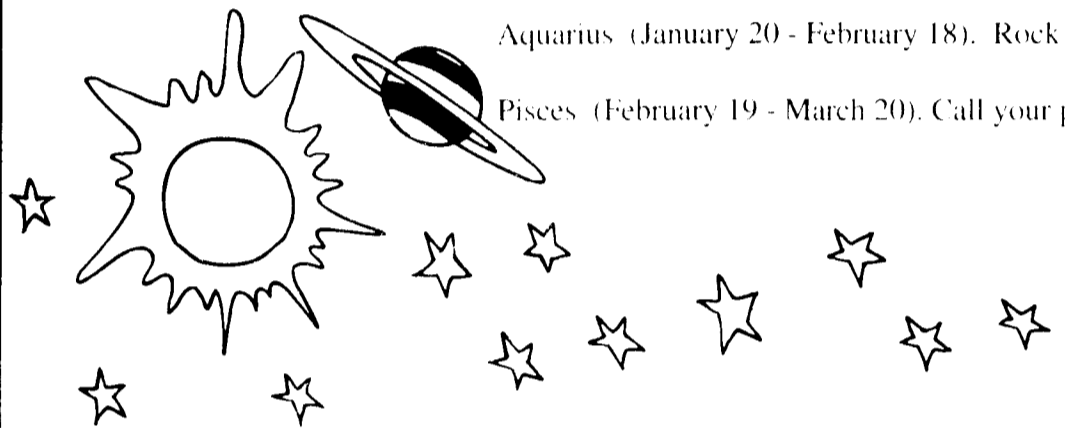

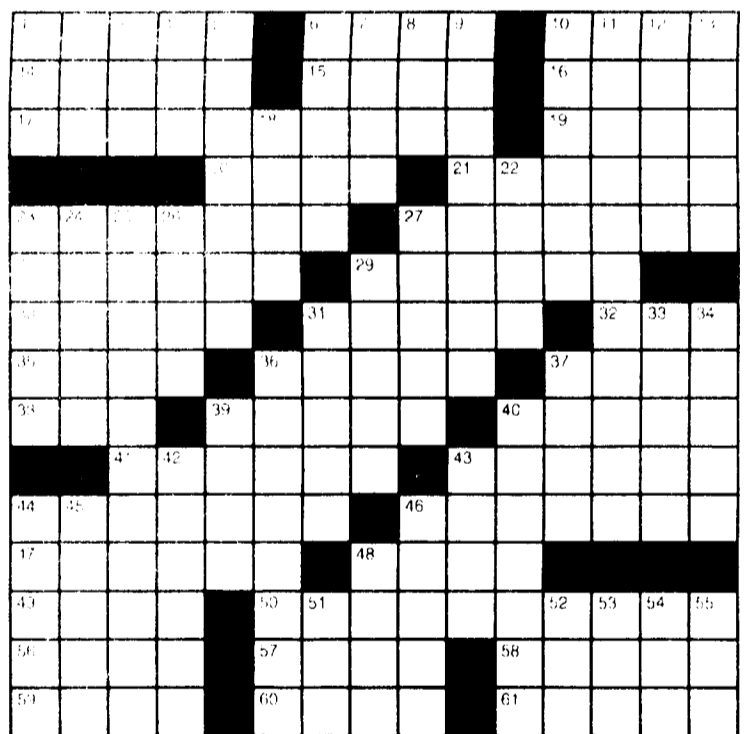
