There would be a New York merger that would revamp the Yanks' starting line-up with the top five New York Mets, because who in New York really cares about the Mets anyway?



So the plan is ready in case New York doesn't win. But all sarcasm aside, George Steinbrenner knows that "losing isn't an option."


