Once the form is filled out, it should be submitted to the LEB Club Liaison. They will then review the request. The other members will vote to approve the co-sponsorship.

Once the club approves an idea, LEB will help organize the funding of the event. It is the club's responsibility, however, to publicize and host the event. During the event, the co-sponsoring club will get the chance to advertise for their club.

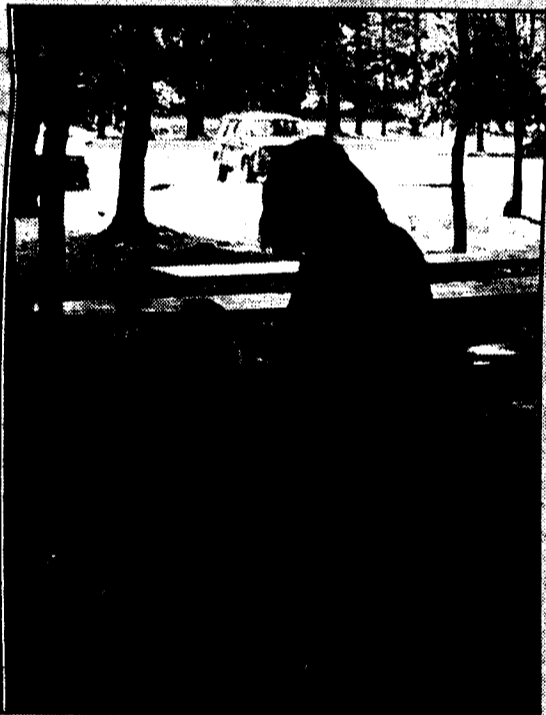

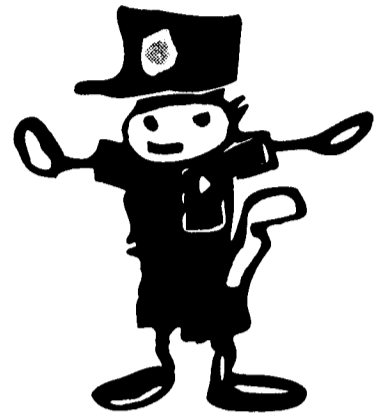
