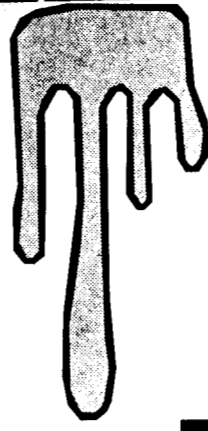


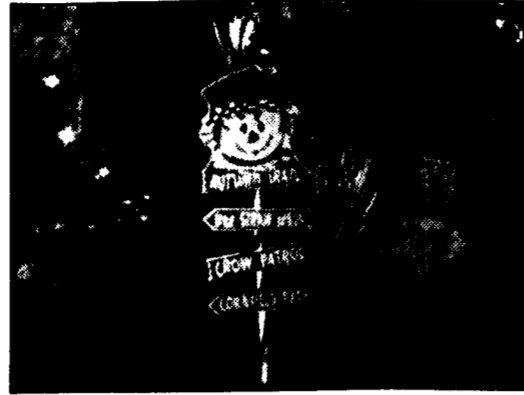
Halloween In "Eerie"

Above: Parents and kids are all about walking the haunted paths (and goofing around) at the ZooBoo playground.

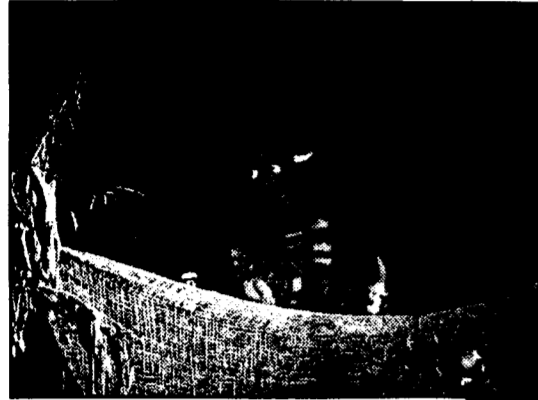
Below: A pumpkin helpfully shows you around the twisting paths at ZooBoo.



At right: Dancing pumpkins welcome you to ZooBoo 2000.

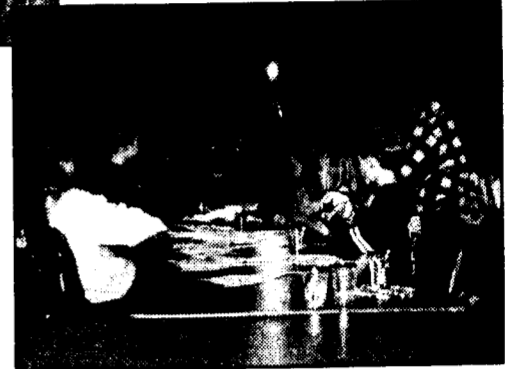


At left: A yummy and fun way to go Trick-or-Treating - and get some goodies before Halloween.

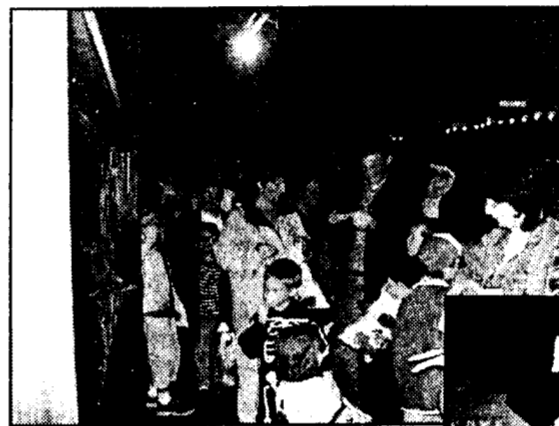


At left: Say Hi to the Boo Buddy at ZooBoo.

At left: A long wait for the haunted train ride at ZooBoo.



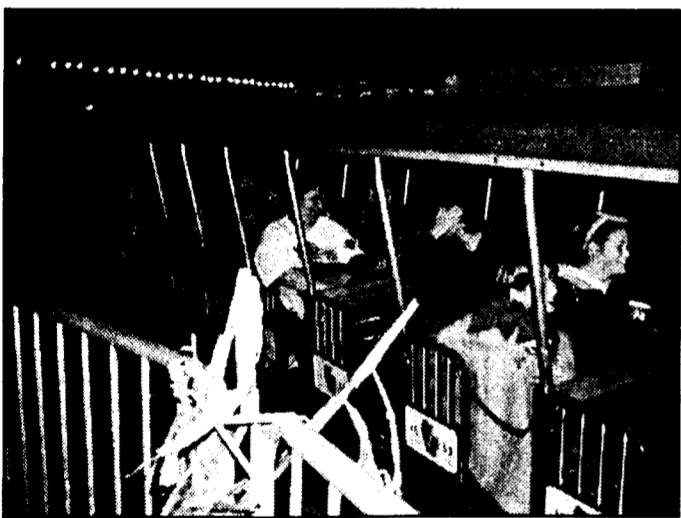

You haven't seen Eerie until you've seen it in costume. Here, a small tour around Eerie and all the "Boo" factors you could imagine...

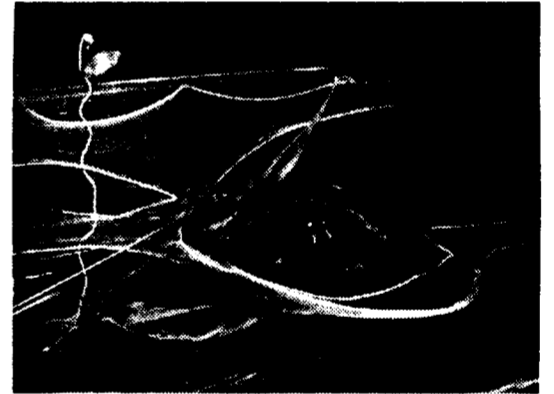

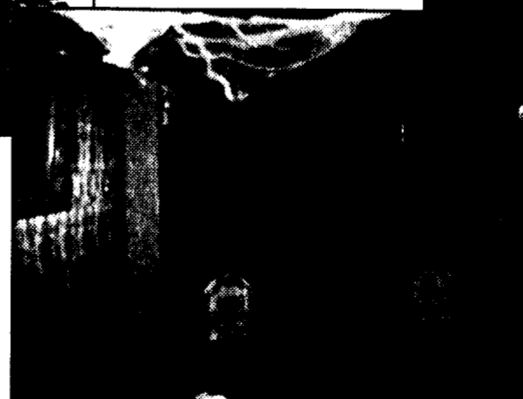

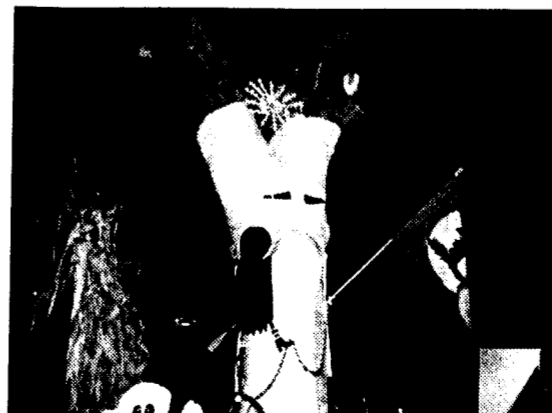

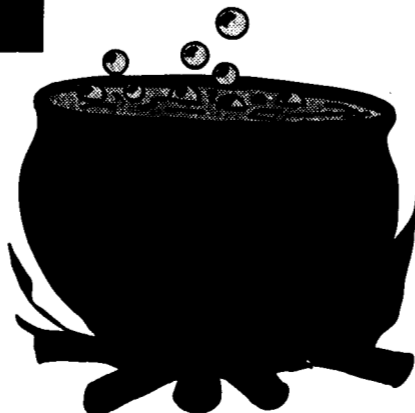
