**BEHREND FOOTBALL?**

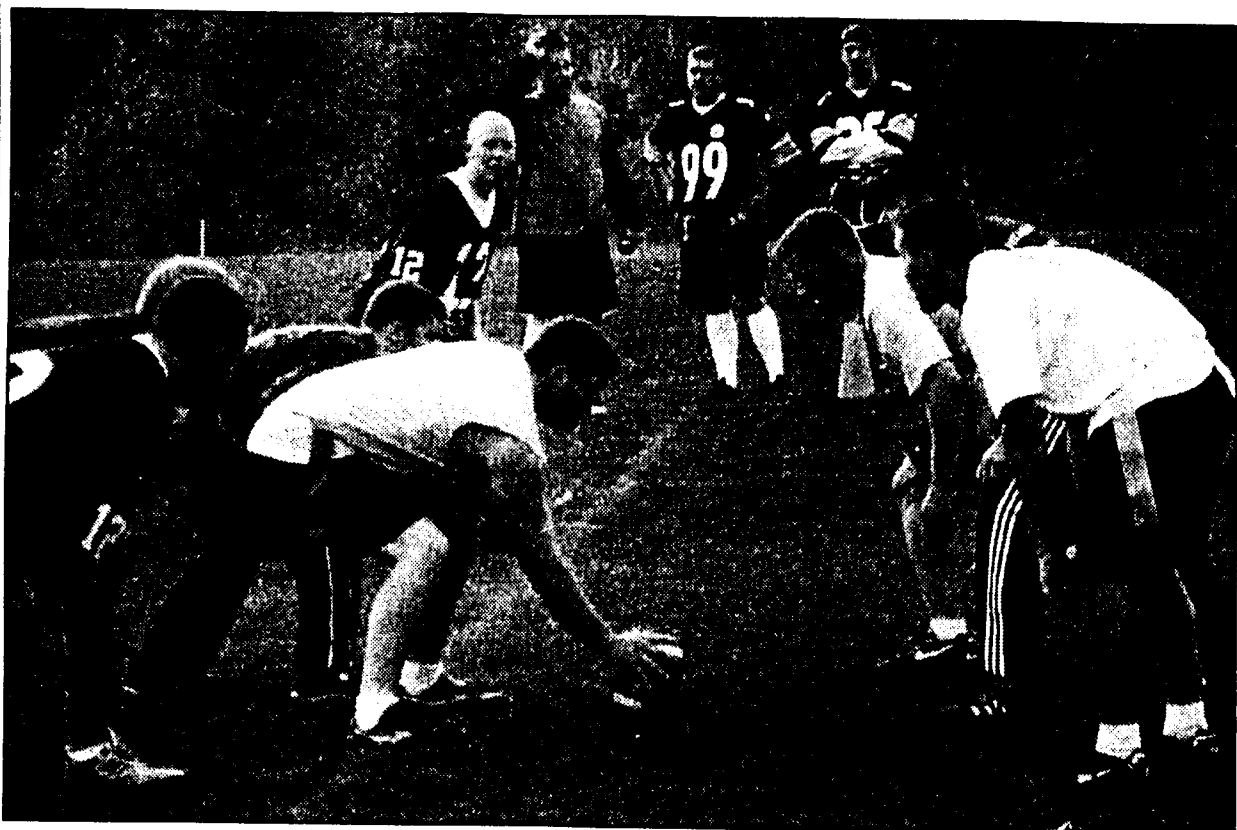

**FEED THE NEED**

Saturday, November 4, during Breakout Day. This is where the clubs and organizations involved in the Feed the Need program go out into the Erie community and collect food. Members of the organizations go door to door and ask for a food donation. Breakout Day will begin with all clubs meeting at the RUB desk at 9:30 a.m. and is scheduled to be finished by noon. All members of the Behrend community are encouraged to participate in Breakout Day.

The second highlight of the food drive takes place during Behrend's Service Week. On Wednesday, November 8, the 'Mile of Food'

will take place outside of the Reed Building. Members of the involved organizations will line up all their collected food to form a chain of food. If there is bad weather, the 'Mile of Food' will take place inside the entrance of the Reed Building. The demonstration is meant to be a visual representation of the food drive.

Each drop-off box will be sponsored by a different organization and will be located at various points throughout the campus and throughout the Erie community. Lambda Sigma and Reality Check's boxes are in Almy and Ohio Halls respectively. The lower dorms, Perry, Niagara, and

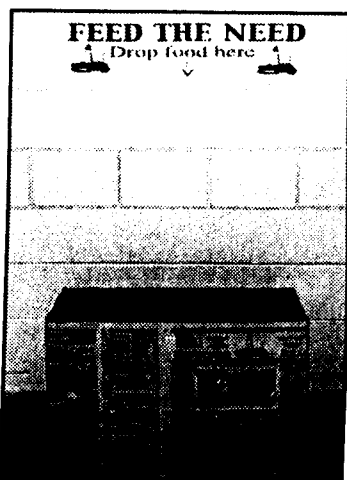
Lawrence Halls, are covered by The *Beacon*, the Matchbox Players and OLAS. Alpha Phi Omega will have boxes in the suites. ODK's box will be in the apartments. SUE will cover the Academic Building, and The Behrend Science Building is covered by Beta Beta Beta. And Alpha Sigma Alpha's box will be located in the Reed Building. The Commuter Council will have boxes in off campus locations such as churches in the Erie community.

"It's a great opportunity because it helps out people in our area," Pflugh said. The food drive runs until November 13, and all donations go to the Second Harvest Food Bank.

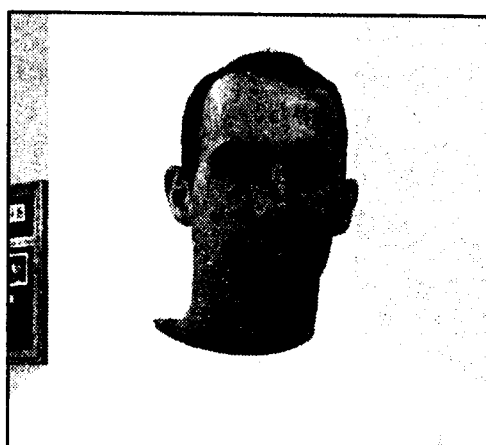
"We should use heavy investigative measures to ascertain who did this, and then we should use what diplomatic measures are necessary to see that this situation is brought to justice."
