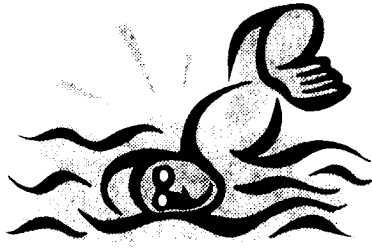

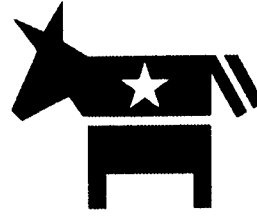

A Closer Look



In the fourth of the 2000-01 Penn State Erie Open House Nights in Astronomy, Professor Roger Knacke will discuss the beginnings and history of the universe in a lecture titled "The Big Bang." Dr. Knacke will present a non-mathematical public lecture describing current understanding of the creation of the universe, including the latest results from astronomical observations. He will include discussions of current questions about the origins of stars and galaxies, and of the mysterious "dark matter" that has perplexed astronomers for several decades.

Dr. Knacke is professor of physics and astronomy and the director of the School of Science at Penn State Erie. He is a NASA-funded scientist and has written extensively in the fields of planetary science, interstellar matter, and star and planet formation. The lecture is free and open to the public. Astronomical observing will follow the lecture, weather permitting.

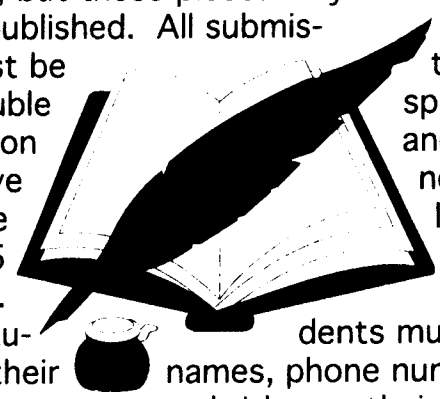
