

Attendant Ghosts, published in November by Cleveland State University Press, is his second collection of poetry. His first, Animals Housed in the Pleasure of Flesh, won the 1995 Bluestem Award. Collections of his have been finalists for many national competitions, including the Yale Younger Poets Series, the National Poetry Series, the White Pine Press competition, and the Ohio State University/ The Journal award. His poetry has received fellowships from the Ohio Arts Council (twice), and won awards from literary journals such as New Letters, The Literary Review, and New Delta Review. His poems have been published by

such journals as The Southern Review, The Kenyon Review, New England Review, The Gettysburg Review, Quarterly West, Shenandoah Tar River Poetry, The Texas Review, Alaska Quarterly Review, Willow Springs, and many more.


