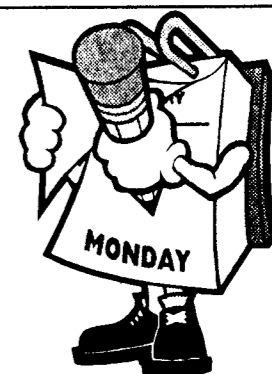

The Music at Noon: The Logan Wintergarden Series at Penn State Erie, The Behrend College, will continue Wednesday, February 7, with a performance by the Zephyros Quintet. The concert, which is free and open to the public, will take place in the Wintergarden at noon.

The Zephyros Quintet, a wind ensemble based in Upper West Side, Manhattan's includes Nadine Jeong-Eun Hur, flute; James Roe, oboe; Michael Aaron Bepko, clarinet; Douglas Quint, bassoon; and Patrick Pridemore, French horn. Pridemore is also a founding member of the group. All five attended The Curtis Institute of Music and The Julliard School.

The Quintet has toured extensively throughout the United States and won both the First and Grand Prizes at the Frischoff National Chamber Music Festival in 1995, only a year after it was formed.
