





Award-winning writer Wendall Mayo will continue the 2000-2001 Creative Writers Speaker Series at Penn State Behrend with a fiction reading on Tuesday, March 20, at 7:00 p.m. in the Reed Lecture Hall.

Mayo is the author of four fiction books, including In Lithuanian Wood, B. Horror and Other Stories, and Centaur of the North, which won the 1997 Aztlan Award. His short stories have appeared in over 70 magazines and anthologies; Mayo is the recipient of a National Endowment for the Arts Creative Writing Fellowship for 2000-20001.



Mayo currently teaches in the creative writing program at Bowling Green State University.





Music at Noon: The Logan Wintergarden Series will wrap up for the year with the Triple Helix Piano Trio on Monday, March 26, in the Reed Wintergarden.

Triple Helix was created in 1995 by three award-winning and internationally known musicians: violinist Bayla Keyes, pianist Lois Shapiro, and cellist Rhonda Rider. They are the artists-in-residence at Wellesley College and have become popular for their signature lecture-recitals in the academic setting.

The name "Triple Helix" is derived from the artists' belief in the spiraling energies that generate life, similar to the intertwining of DNA strands.
