Babes in Arms focuses on the fun, frustrations, and romances of a group of college-age would-be actors and actresses at a summer theatre in New England. When their tyrannical producer works them so hard that they never have a chance showcase their talents, the group

decides to produce their own show on their own time.

While the plot of *Babes in Arms* is simple, the music is not. The show contains some of Richard Rodgers and Lorenz Hart's most memorable and time-tested songs: Where or When, I Wish I Were in Love Again, My Funny Valentine, Johnny One Note, and The Lady is a Tramp. The name "Triple Helix" is derived from the artists' belief in the spiraling energies that generate life, similar to the intertwining of DNA strands.




