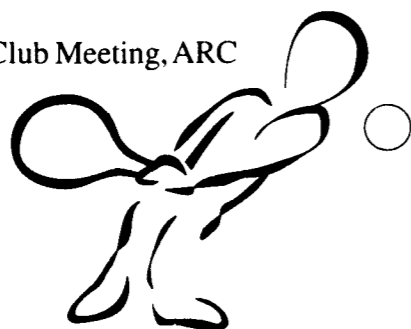

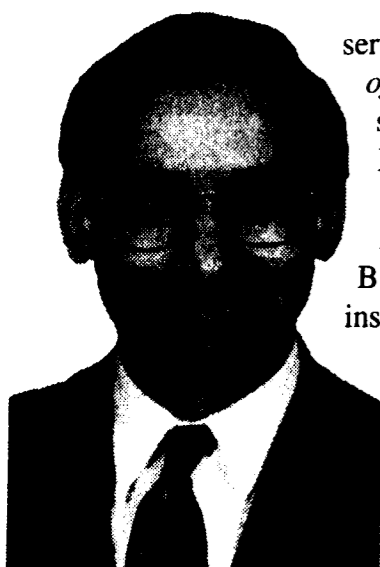
### PROVOST'S SPEAKER SERIES

Dr. Syed Saad Andaleeb, associate professor of marketing, will discuss "Teaching Research: Challenges and Payoffs" in the last installment of the 2000-2001 Provost's Speaker Series. This lecture will take place on Monday, April 2, at noon in the Reed Lecture Hall.

Andaleeb is the recipient of the 2000 Council of Fellows Faculty Research Award. Andaleeb's research focuses on consumer behavior in health care, education, and marketing. He has written and presented numerous papers on these topics.

A native of Bangladesh, Andaleeb serves as an editor for the new *Journal of Bangladesh Studies*, which is sponsored by the Bangladesh Development Initiative and the Association for Economic and Development Studies on Bangladesh. Andaleeb was also instrumental in the development of the marketing major at Penn State Behrend.

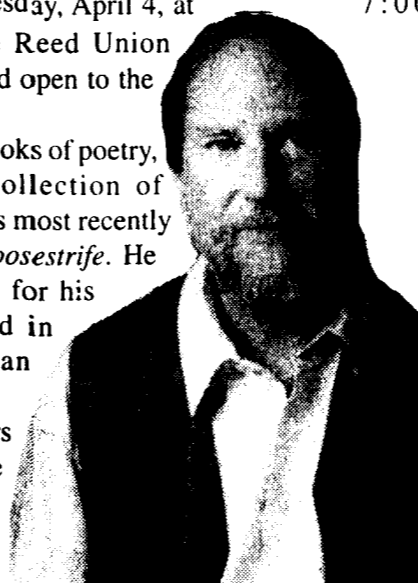


### CONCLUSION OF CREATIVE WRITERS SPEAKER SERIES

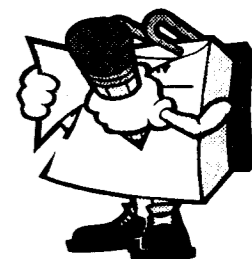
