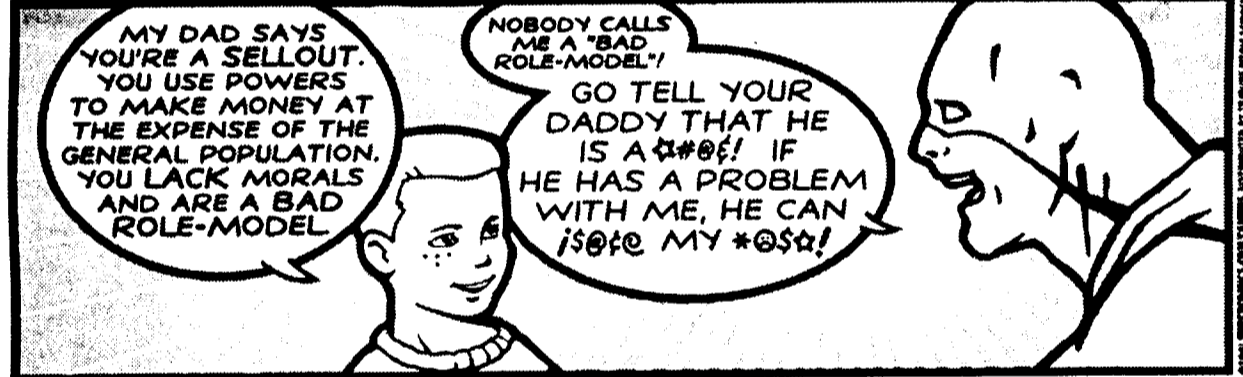

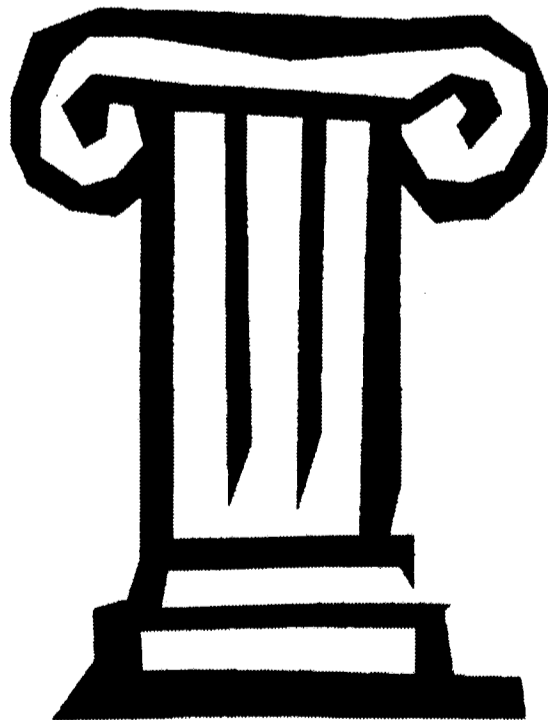

Greek Facts Think About It!!!

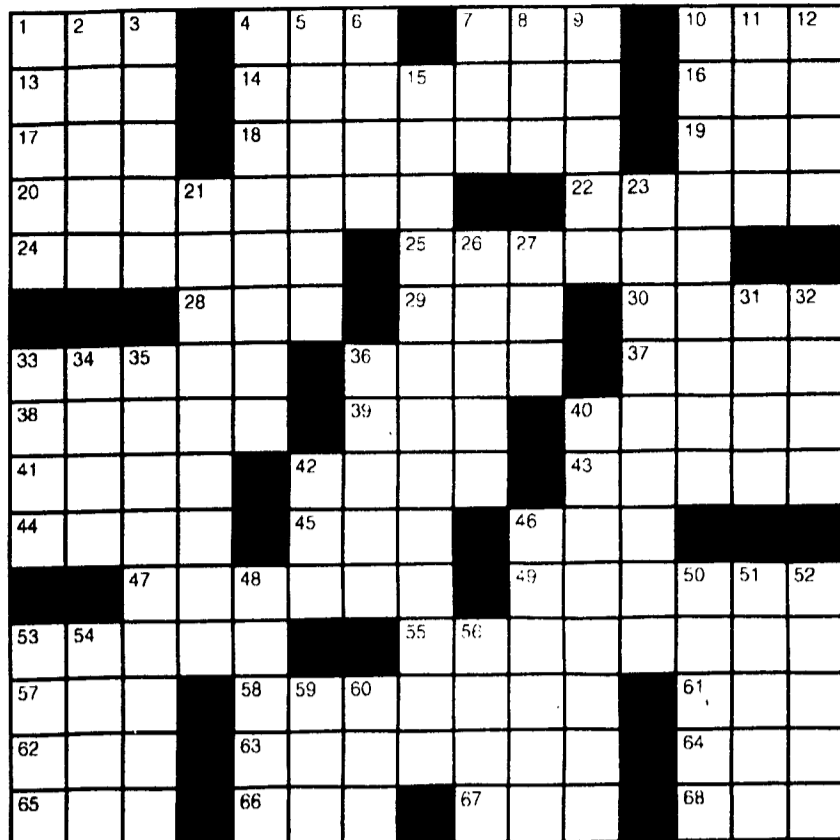
- * 76% of US Congressman and Senators are Greek

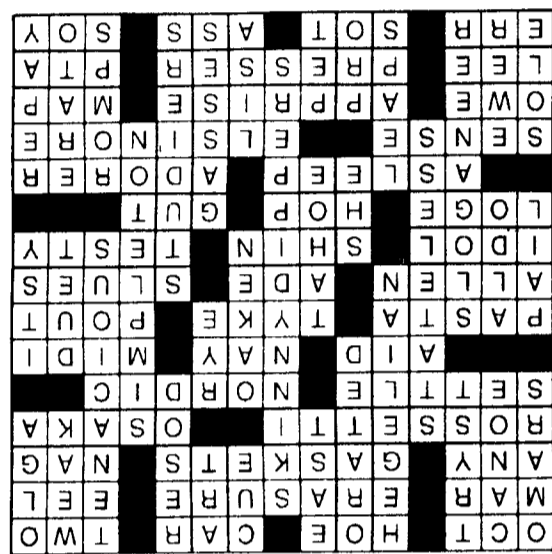
