Elaine Parke to speak

On Nov. 27, author Elaine Park will speak, courtesy of the Behrend Bookstore and "Lake Effect," Behrend's literary magazine. The 6 p.m. presentation, which is free to the public, will take place in Reed 117.

Parke, who wrote the acclaimed "Join the Golden Rule Revolution," won the Pennsylvania Health Department's Violence Free Youth Challenge contest and the Pennsylvania State Violence-Free Youth Governor's Award for her curriculum. Her Caring Habit of the Month program incorporated slogans, banners, and posters to encourage friendliness. The result was decreased violence and increased homework completion.

Parke's articles have recently appeared in publications of the National Association of School Psychologists, the Education Digest, and the National Association of Secondary School Principals. Although she says her ideas are not new, she hopes they will help to create a revolution in caring.

NEW BASKETBALL MOVIE


