

# Hot Spots in Erie

How many times have you awoken from a drunken stupor at 4 p.m. on a Sunday afternoon wondering where your weekend went? If you're sick and tired of being blacked out every weekend all weekend, I suggest you sober up and dust off your skateboard, BMX bike, or fruit boots, and head on over to Shebang skate park.

That's right, Erie has its' very own indoor skatepark. Clocking in at 19,000 square feet, Shebang is by far the largest skatepark in the area. Shebang boasts a 7ft spine, a 4ft high, 32 ft wide mini with a 41/2 ft E, a rhythm section for bmxers, a pyramid, a 4 ft street spine, as well as various wallrides, sub-boxes and quarter pipes. There is also a fully stocked pro shop with BMX parts, skateboards, shoes, snowboards, and accessories.

Designed more for BMXers than skaters, Shebang gets a 6.5 on the patented Ben Kundman "Hesh vs. Fresh\*" scale, (10 being hesh, 0 being fresh). The mini ramp is mellow enough to allow even the most transition phobic tech-dog a chance to hone his or her tranny skills. Overall, from a skateboarding

perspective, I say the park gets a 7/10 for skateboarders, and from what BMXers have told me, 8.5/10 for bikes. I try to avoid talking to fruitbooters at all costs, but they seem to love it there.

Shebang skate park is located at 2411 W 12<sup>th</sup> street, next to Dunn Tire. For hours, rates, and other information, visit

If you're looking to avoid little kids whose only talent is getting in your way, I suggest hitting up the \$5 8-10 p.m. session Monday-Thursday nights. (It's also \$5 Friday and Saturday nights but they're both rather hectic). \* "Hesh" skaters are generally a more rugged bunch, with chain wallets, dirty old clothes, tattoos, and cases of Highlife in the trunk. Their skateboarding usually involves big transitions concrete (when possible) and big airs.

\*\* "Fresh" skaters are usually outfitted in the latest gear: swishy pants, DCs, and whatever shirt is in style that month. Their skateboarding usually consists of technical flatground tricks like switch 360° flips, ledge tricks, and the occasional gap or handrail. (Of course most skateboarders fall somewhere between "hesh" and "fresh" but these represent the two extremes).
