

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Lions set off to fast start at Blue-White swim meet

Seven meet records broken, one meet record tied, and six team records almost broken. All of this success and it was only an intra-squad meet.

The second annual Swimming and Diving Blue-White Meet jumped off the blocks last Saturday into what could be a very successful season.

Head coach Josh Heynes attributes his team's success in the first meet to a new workout routine and an earlier start.

"This year we started a few weeks earlier than in the past. We have also initiated a strict and intense dry land and cardio routine, including weights, running, and medicine ball work. Last year, we lacked a lot of strength in some races. This season should turn out to be a different season with this new program," said Heynes.

The new workout program has certainly proved successful so far.

The men's team kicked off its season by setting a new meet record in its first race. A relay team of Travis Kochel. Brian Vallor, Jeff Howard, and Carl Ward set the new record of 1:38:64 in the 200 yard freestyle relay, just six seconds off the team record.

Freshman Kochel broke another record in the 50 yard freestyle. With his time of 23.22

Coming off a stellar water polo season, senior Ben Atkins continued strong in the 500 yard freestyle. Atkins' time of 5:19:67 broke the third men's meet record for the day.

"I think the Blue-White Meet is a real good thing," said Atkins. "It is good for the freshmen to see how a college meet works. It's also good because it has been awhile since the last time we competed in a race atmosphere."

Not to be outdone, the women of the Blue and White squads set four new records and tied one record. Blue squad member Tara Braden set the meet record for the 100 yard breaststroke in 1:15:76, less than a second off the team record she set last year.

Her counterpart, White squad member Christine Williams, broke the remaining women's records. Sophomore Williams finished first in five out of six races and broke records for the 100 yard backstroke. 500 yard freestyle, and 200 yard freestyle. Williams is just two seconds away from setting new team records in each event.

Williams' performance, along with Kochel and Atkins, allowed both the women's and men's White Squad to post a victory over the Blue squads in the Blue-
