

Mother Nature doesn't like to cooperate with spring sporting events, especially those in Erie. After having two away games against Pitt-Bradford and Pitt-Greensburg postponed, the Lions opened up their home season on Tuesday against Westminster.

In the first game, Behrend sent veteran Becky Corbin to the circle. Westminster hit Corbin hard and scored nine runs. The Lions' offense was cold and couldn't get started. Behrend lost 9-1.

Erika Mack put on a defensive clinic for Behrend at third base. Mack knocked down numerous grounders and speared a couple of line drives from Westminster.

When not at the hot corner, Mack is behind the plate where she feels more comfortable.

"I've caught since I started playing softball, so I'm much more familiar with catching. I didn't start playing third until last season, so I put more practice in at third," said Mack.

"At third, you never know what's coming at you, so you have to be prepared for everything."

In the second game, freshman Kim Raff kept Westminster off balance by using good movement with her pitches. The Lions' bats came alive and rallied, but they fell short again, losing 5-4.

"Offense is such an amazing part of softball, and as a team,

we have been lacking in that area. It's amazing what can happen when we get a few hits," said Corbin.

Continuing the defensive clinic started by Mack were infielder Charity Marsh and outfielder Brandy Polinick. Shortstop Marsh fielded a ground ball cleanly, stepped on second, and then fired to first for an unassisted double play. Polinick reeled in a ball hit deep with an over-the-shoulder catch.

Heading into this weekend, the Lions open their AMCC schedule on the road against 2002 AMCC runner-up Penn State Altoona. Behrend went 0-2 against Altoona last year.

This year, it's anybody's game. Behrend and Altoona are ranked near each other in almost every category in the AMCC. Behrend is equal with Altoona in team batting average. Corbin moved from third to second best ERA, while Raff shows improvement in each start.

"Though we've had a rough start, I still believe we have what it takes to be very competitive in the AMCC," said Corbin.

"When we play to our best ability, we can do some amazing things."




