

Lauren Packer (Fleming/ Bald Eagle) was named this week's Beacon/Food and Housing Athlete of the Week.

Packer is a third year starter, and co-captain of the women's water polo team. She had 17 key blocks in the win over Mercyhurst on March 30

and has 178 saves out of 333 shots taken in the 2003 season. Packer's blocking percentage is 53%, which is the highest ever for a goalie on the team.

"Lauren is the defensive foundation for the team, said head coach Josh Heynes.
