Penn State Behrend's Child Care Center will celebrate the tenth anniversary of its opening on Wednesday, Sept. 17, with an open house from 5-7:00 p.m. at the center. The Center is located at 5450 Merwin Lane in Knowledge Park.

"The Child Care Center has cared for more than 800 children over the past 10 years," said Eunice Moore, director.

"The staff has had the privilege of knowing many wonderful children and families and of watching the center develop a strong tradition of high-quality child care." The center currently serves 91 children between the ages of six weeks and six years.

The center moved from its previous location at 5650 Station Road in 2002 to accommodate construction of the new Eastside Access Highway. Children took easily to the center's new 8,600-square-foot building in the wooded Knowledge Park setting. In addition to two rooms each for infants, toddlers and pre-school students, it also includes a multipurpose room, a research and conference room and an office for the director. It is a bright and cheerful location for both children and staff, and we look forward to serving children in this area for years to come."
