

These issues are very important and should by no means be ignored, but the true emphasis needs to lie in what is taking place here at Behrend. Issues such as parking, food choice and cost, advising and curriculum are Behrend issues that still need looked at. The emphasis should take place in these.

The last focal point is within the students themselves. A suggestion box should be used again. E-mails, names and faces of SGA should be recognizable to all students with greater ease. My platform for the upcoming year is one of club involvement! I am committed to increasing student involvement on campus, especially club enrollment and participation. As a member of




