The women finished third out of 17 teams. Strong runner, Jess Knapp, took third place out of 128 women runners. Knapp's time was 18:46 for the 5k.

Leslie Gentile finished eighth with a time of 19:34, Claire Manelick finished 22<sup>nd</sup> in 20:21 and Willa Paterson finished

25th with a time of 20:27. Leisl Soergel and Sara Lucas also ran in the invita-

The hard practices have played a big role in the success of the blue and white. Coach Cooper has the men running 6-13 miles, and the women running 5-11 each day.

Unfortunately, injuries have plagued some of the Behrend runners. These injuries have set the team back in some aspect.

The team lost Saturday in an intense game against Pitt-Greensburg. The final score was


The game drew one of Behrend's larger crowds. Although the game resulted in a loss for the men, a few fans enjoyed the game for more than the pure pleasure of good athletics.
