## Hockey team off to record start

Behrend's hockey team is off to the best start in the team's history and proved itself against team rival Edinboro. On Saturday, Dec. 3, the Blue and White outshot, outscored, overpowered and simply outplayed the Fighting Scots in their 10-2 victory. For the entire game, Behrend outshot Edinboro 55-15: With a powerful offense and a suffocating defense led by goaltender Pat Laskey's 13 saves, the Lions dominated every aspect of the game.

"Edinboro was the peak of our season. We played together and it was the best

game of the season so far,' said sophomore Daniel Thiessen.

Goals were scored by J.B. Beers (2), Joe Persang (2), Brysten Jones (2), Tim McGill. Brad Alayon, Daren Douglas, and Jon Romenelli. Other points were contributed by D.J. Craven with two assists, Alayon with three assists, Beers, Persang and Romenelli. Thiessen, Adam Pennypacker, Eric Baluh, Max Polinski,

Andrew Bittner, Eric Fry, with one assist each. Adding to the success of the offense, Behrend also capitalized on four of the nine powerplays.

Another notable accomplishment for Behrend was the nearly flawless shutdown of Edinboro's and College Hockey East's leading scorer, Nick Tucci, who had accumulated 14 goals before Saturday night's game. Behrend's tenacious defense held Tucci to only one goal, his only point for the entire game.

Following the Edinboro game, Behrend

fell to non-conference Robert Morris 6-3 at RMU's Island Sports Center. Leading the scoring for Behrend was Polinski with two goals and Craven with one goal. Assists for the Blue and White were credited to Jones with two and Thiessen with one. Since this was a non-conference game, the loss does not affect Behrend's standing in College Hockey East.

Overall. Behrend is 8-3 with a 5-1 CHE record and sits atop the North division. Improving from last year's 4-7-3 record, the Lions look to make a run at the playoffs and a potential League Title. "We all hope to make the playoffs for the first time in our team's history. If we keep working hard and realize our goals, we can definitely

accomplish that," Thiessen. The hockey team also finds itself ranked nationally

in the American Collegiate Hockey Association Division III. Behrend is currently ranked tenth in the North Region of the Association.



## Behrend women rely on depth for success

The Lady Lions basketball team began their season in the Behrend Tip-Off Tournament on Nov. 18 with a dominating performance over Westminster, a 68-57 win. The next day, the Blue and White faced Case Western in the championship game, but fell short by a count of 74-59.

After the long Thanksgiving break, the

squad began conference play in the AMCC. On Dec. 2, the Lady Lions traveled south for two games in two days. First, the team squared off against Pitt-Greensburg for a hard-fought contest but lost by a score of 75-71. Unfortunately for the Lions, Ladv Pitt-Greensburg senior forward Tish Hines dropped 32 points to give the opponents the edge.

The next day, the Lady Lions didn't fare much better. Frostburg State jumped out to a 42-20 lead at halftime and never

looked back as they emerged victorious, 69-53.

On Dec. 6, the "hoop squad," as the team likes to call itself, was set to face Fredonia at home, but due to a horrible snowstorm, the game was postponed to a time to be determined later.

"I guess Fredonia was on their way down the interstate, but the cops closed the road," said Behrend forward Annemarie Priester. "We showed up to the Junker, and wondered why Coach Fornari wasn't in her usual suit and why

she was waiting for us at the door. She told us the game was canceled."

Tonight and tomorrow, the Lady Lions will host their Winter Classic Tournament. On Friday. Thomas More will face Buffalo State at 6 p.m. followed by Behrend vs. Grove City at 8 p.m. On Saturday, the consolation game will take place at 1 p.m., and the champi-

onship game will be at 3 p.m. The Lady Lions hope to end their three-game losing streak with a first-place finish in the Winter Classic.

So far this season, junior guard Brittany Mays leads the team in scoring with 14.8 points per game and in total rebounds with 28. Mays also limits her turnovers, which is vital for this young team to do in order to be successful. She only has four turnovers in four games. Mays was also selected as one of the "best of the best" for the week by the AMCC with her performances against Pitt-Greensburg and Frostburg State. She averaged 16 points and 10 rebounds. which amounted to an average of a double-double. Sophomore guard Jessica Serafin is second in scoring with 11.5 points per game. She is shooting a sizzling 12 for 27 (44 percent) from threepoint range. Junior forward Rachel Slomski is third in scoring with 10.8 points per game and second in total rebounds with 26.

Other primary contributors include freshman forward Victoria Innes, who averages 7.8 points per game; sophomore forward Annemarie Priester who averages 8.5 points in conference play; and senior guard Kristie Connolly, who comes off the bench to provide a spark on defense. Everyone on the team averages at least 10 minutes per game, which shows Behrend's great depth.
