In the aftermath of Jonathan Demerecz's arrest, Penn State Behrend is starting to assess the damage that can potentially amount in his absence. On Nov. 9, Demerecz was charged with 22 second degreefelony counts of possession of child pornography and one first-degree misdemeanor charge of possessing an instrument of crime, referring to his computer.


