Mike Ferraro (Erie/Harborcreek) has been named the Housing and Food Services Athlete of the Week for the week of March 26. Ferraro started for the men's track & field team who kicked off their outdoor season on Saturday at the California University of Pennsylvania Invitational.

Ferraro took first place in the 100-meter dash with a new school record of 11.13 seconds in his first collegiate outdoor event. The time qualifies him for the ECAC Championships at the season's end. Ferraro went on to place second in the 200-meter dash with a time of 22.78 seconds. He then concluded his strong outdoor debut by teaming up with three others to take second in the 4 x 100 meter relay with another ECAC qualifying time of 44.24 seconds.

Thiessen is a goaltender for the Butler County Bulldogs, which are based out of Mars, PA.

Thiessen, who is also a goaltender for the Penn State Behrend Ice Hockey Club, believes that his team truly has a shot at winning the title this year.

"It's a great group of guys we have and a lot of them were on the team last year when we reached nationals. With the way we have been playing, it's gonna be hard to beat us at nationals," Thiessen said.

Last year, Thiessen and the Bulldogs reached nationals for the first time in team

history. The Bulldogs made it to the finals and lost in double overtime to the Aspen Americans. With it being a year since the second place finish, Thiessen is trying to move on from the heartbreaking loss he suffered last year. "Well, it was hard to lose like that. We have moved on since the loss and understand that it was in the past and the present is now."

The young Thiessen came here from Penn State New Kensington after one semester and joined the Behrend hockey club in the middle of the season. He went 2-1-1 and started for the team in Behrend's playoff loss. Going into next season, Thiessen said he'd like to have a national championship under his belt.


"I think last year was just a stepping stone for this year. They finished strong in 2005 and they have the talent and potential for a title run this season," Jaworski said.
