## Behrend softball looking for another championship

The Penn State Behrend softball team took their spring training down to Clermont, Florida for their Spring Break. From March 8-14, the women played two games per day against a handful of opponents. The Blue and White wrapped up the week with a record of 8-2.

The women come into the season with a successful year in 2007 owning a record of 29-16 and a trip to the ECAC Tournament for the first time since 1995. The 2008 team poses a strong chance for success for Behrend as they return seven starters and four other roster players.

Stacey Pondo returns for her fifth year as head coach for the Lions. Pondo is assisted by coaches Joe Dulak, Karla Murray and Tom Jakubowski. In 2006, after winning the AMCC Championship, Pondo coached the women to their first NCAA Tournament appearance. Along with coaching. Pondo is also the assistant to the director of athletics. In 2006, she was named the AMCC Coach of the Year. In 2005, she took Behrend to the

AMCC semifinals and was named AMCC Co-Coach of the Year.

Eleven players from the 2007 season return to the 2008 roster, including seven starters. Lauren Lubic is the only senior on the team this year followed by 10 standout juniors. Three of the 10 juniors are All-AMCC First-Team players. Julie Koman will lead the team from the mound, while Nikki Kaschauer will hold down second base and Katie Whitby in centerfield. Kaschauer was named the AMCC Softball Player of the Week and Koman was named the AMCC Pitcher of the Week for the week of March 17.

Other juniors contributing to the team are infielder Rachel Lawrence, outfielder Allison Babish, catcher Lindsay Baughman, third basemen Michelle Zil, first base/pitcher Laura Frischkorn, first Cassie Miksie.

The freshmen class comprises almost half of the team. Making up the under-


