~Hal and Hank Steinbrenner were made cochairpersons of the New York Yankees on Thursday by their father, owner George Steinbrenner.

George Steinbrenner, who has controlled the team since 1973, is chairperson, essentially the same as his previous title of chairman. The sons took over supervision of the team's daily operations last year.

~Penn State Football coach Joe Paterno decided to delay his contract talks until the end of the 2008-2009 season.

Penn State president Graham Spanier told the Associated Press, through an e-mail, that both the school and Paterno agree a new deal is not necessary right now.

Paterno is entering his 43 season as head coach at Penn State.

The Miami Dolphins have begun contract negotiations with Michigan's Jake Long and Ohio State's Vernon Gholston. The Dolphins have the No. 1 pick in the NFL Draft, which will be held April 26-27.

Long, who is considered the top offensive lineman in the upcoming NFL Draft, faced Gholston in November, when Ohio State defeated Michigan 14-3.

-Pittsburgh Steelers running back Najah **Davenport** was acquitted of a misdemeanor domestic violence charge Wednesday, April 10 in Cleveland Municipal Court.

Davenport had been accused of slapping and punching Anita Person, the mother of his 5year-old son at her Cleveland home in October. He was also acquitted on his misdemeanor for child endangering and unlawful restraint.

Behrend baseball getting used to winning ways



> sealed the deal in the seventh inning, with the bases loaded, RBI bunt single from Paskinski to give the men their 13 consecutive victory.



The story of day one was Ian Poulter's hole-in-one on number 16. Poulter hit an eight-iron on the 170 yard par-3 that is nicknamed

"Redbud." "As soon as it left the club, I knew it was going to be pretty good," Poulter said. "It was quite nice to see it drop." After his ace, news began to travel throughout the crowd about Poulter's amazing shot. Even hours after his round, Poulter was feeling the effects from the shot. "There was an unbelievable buzz," said Poulter. "That was a special moment. The hairs on the back of my neck were standing up. It was great."

With isolated showers threatening tomorrow's round of golf, tee times may be delayed. Coverage of the Masters' begins at 4 p.m. on ESPN.
