According to the Collegian, Penn State will not be using Napster, the previous choice for music distribution at the University. A Penn State official said that it was not the University's responsibility to provide a service, says the Collegian.

Ruckus is the second college-oriented site to shut down in the past week, joining JuicyCampus.com in websites that have crumbled amidst the recession. The company's founder and CEO, Matt Ivester, posted a note on the site's blog, explaining the reason for the site's downfall.

"Unfortunately, even with great traffic and strong user loyalty, a business can't survive and grow without a steady stream of revenue to support it," he wrote. He later denied any rumors that the site's demise had anything to do with investigations by two states' attorney generals, and numerous accusations of libel.
