MEADVILLE

The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation announced this morning that one of the northbound I-79 lanes will open to traffic on Monday, along with the northbound offramp to Conneaut Lake and the eastbound on-ramp to I-79 north at Routes 6/322.

The opening marks the near completion of a two-year, \$26.3 million project that replaced the two bridges carrying I-79 over Routes 6/322 and made other associated improvements to the interchange.

All interstate lanes should be open by the end of October, once the contractor completes guide rail installation and other finishing tasks, PennDOT spokeswoman Deborah Casadei said this morning.

WARREN

A Warren man and his two passengers were injured when his vehicle was struck in a head-on collision Wednesday afternoon.

Police said Cassandra L. Snyder, 18, lost control of her vehicle and crossed the center line of Route 69 in Farmington Township. About 3:52 p.m., the Youngsville Woman hit a vehicle driven by 20-year-old Nickolas Nelson, of Warren.

Nelson was flown to Hamot Medical Center, where he was listed in serious condition this morning.

Police said Montrel D. Amos told a clerk at the Circle K convenience store at 3327 Pine Ave. that he had a gun before stealing juice and candy just before 11 p.m. Wednesday. A witness was able to give police a description of the getaway vehicle, and police stopped the car a short time later, finding Amos inside.

He was arrested and charged with robbery, simple assault, possessing instruments of a crime, and retail theft. Police said they recovered the candy and juice, but did not find a weapon.

6. US deficit 'hits record \$1.4tn'

Washington, D.C. -- The US budget deficit hit a record \$1.4 trillion in the year to 30 September, US Congress estimates

Analysts had predicted a \$1.6tn deficit but revised the estimate, which comes after the end of the US financial year.

The deficit was equal to 9.9% of gross domestic product more than treble the 2008 level and the highest since the end of World War II.
