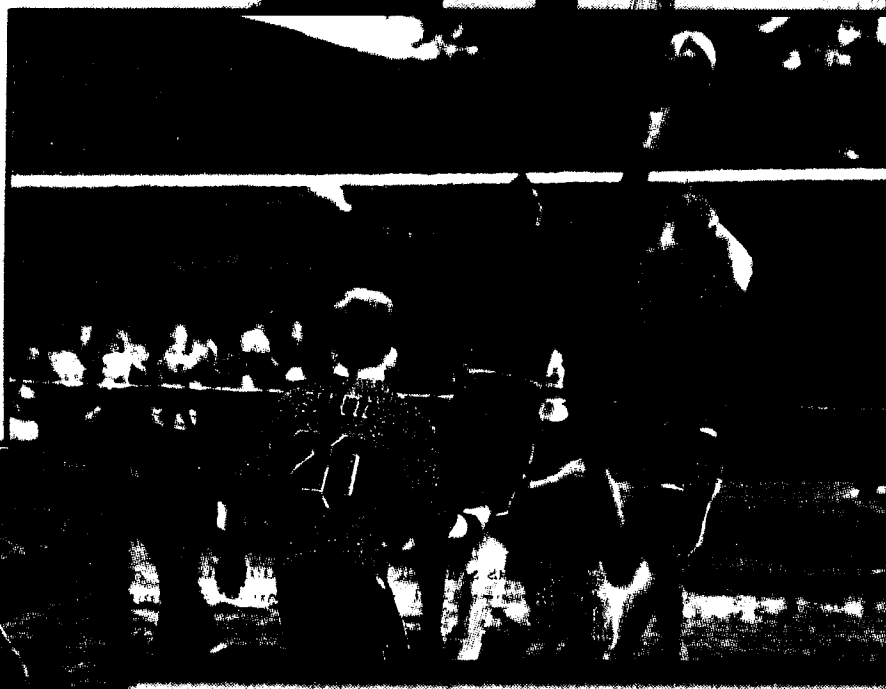
This week's sights and scenes caught on camera.

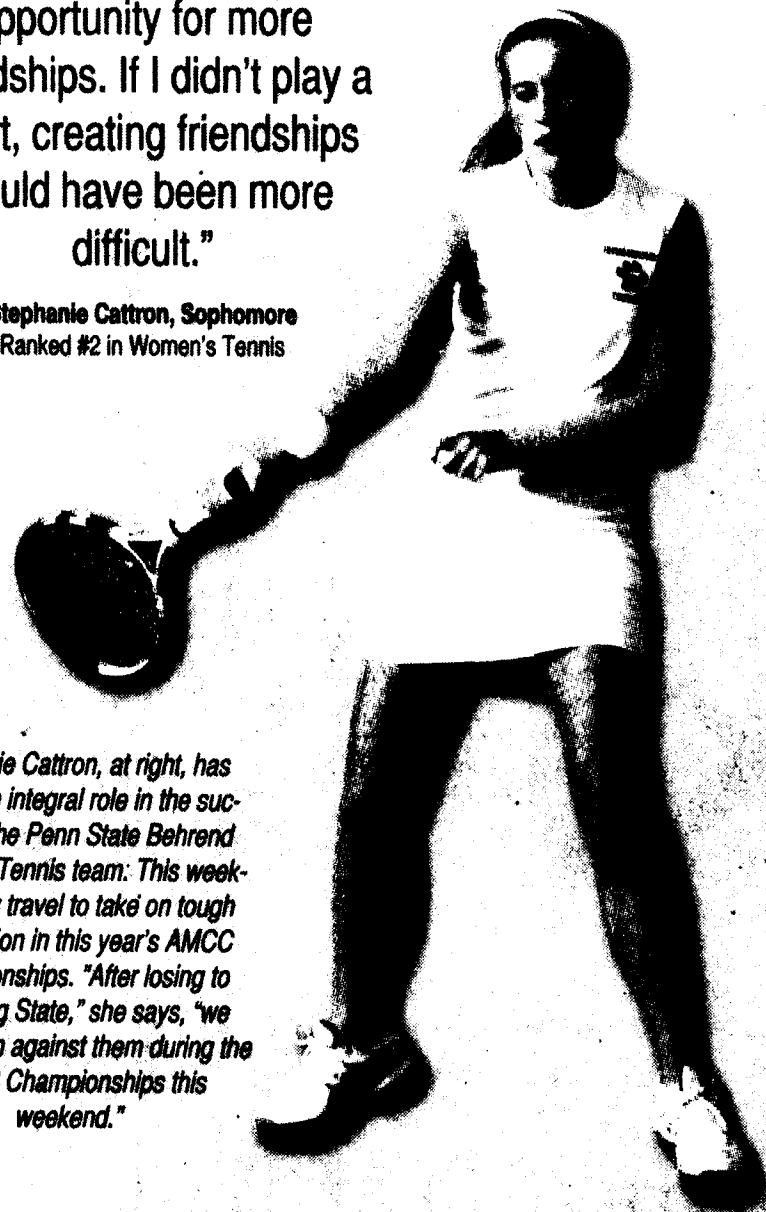
