

# Behrend's THON team gears up for another season of fundraising

Students at Penn State Behrend will soon have the opportunity to go "24 For a Cure" in Erie Hall as part of Penn State's THON fundraising campaign.

Accord-THON chairs Carly Lapp and Erin Moran, the 24-hour dance marathon place Nov. 7 in Erie Hall, and will be the main event in

Behrend's fundraising efforts. Last vear, about 50 students participated as dancers,

"Last year we raised more than \$29,000. This year, we want to more than double that, so we set our goal at \$65,000."

Lapp said that to be a dancer in the "24 For a Cure" event, students must raise at least \$75, security and moralers don't have to raise any

money, just volunteer for the event.

Both Lapp and Moran were members of THON last year, and both agreed that it was everything they expected. "You really don't understand what it is, how big it is, until you're a part of it." said Lapp. "It's the biggest student-run philanthropy in the

Both Lapp and Moran agreed that there were a few things they wanted to improve from last year, including getting more of their organizing done ahead of time, being more organized in general, and having more fundrais-

"We want to have at least one big fundraiser going on every month until Big THON at University Park," said Moran, "last year we raised more than \$29,000. This year, we want to more than double that, so we set our goal at \$65,000." Currently, THON is selling holiday-

themed cutouts for \$1 to raise money for the charity, and will continue doing so until finals week.

"We have a lot of fundraising ideas that are still in the brainstorming stage" said Lapp.

Both Lapp and Moran agreed that the focus of the event was on raising money for a worthy cause, but acknowledged that they would like to be among the top 3 Commonwealth campuses in money raised this year, up from the number five spot last year.
