Nine Behrend soccer players are given All-Conference honors

The Penn State Behrend Lions women's soccer team may not have finished in first place in the ECAC tournament, but the girls have nothing to hang their heads about.

On Nov. 15 the Lady Lions played in the ECAC tournament game against Swarthmore College, a team who won the ECAC South Tournament in 2007 and 2008.

Behrend came out empty handed, but Coach Patrick O'Driscoll sees it as an accomplishment.

"It was an awesome game," O'Driscoll said. "As a coach it was great to watch the girls, because of how well they were playing

against such a strong team."

The first half was fairly even, back and forth play. The last 15 minutes of the game we just couldn't get the ball out of our end of the field."

The winning goal wasn't scored until the fifty-sixth minute of play by junior Kirsten Peterson

Junior Jaclyn Stottlemeyer also agreed with Coach O'Driscoll saying, "I think we played really well, they came out really strong in the second half and scored but we never stopped fighting. We just kept playing really hard."

Another reason why the Lady Lions' program shouldn't hang their heads is because they had nine girls AMCC All-Conference

selections.

O'Driscoll was named Coach of the Year for his hard work during the season and turning around the blue and white's record from 7-12-1 to 15-4-3 ending record.

The AMCC First Team consisted of senior goalkeeper Kayla Frost, junior defender Kelly Thill, and also freshman Valerie Wagner. Frost was named AMCC goalkeeper of the week twice while recording a season total of 78 saves.

Thill started in all 22 games and was a key performer on defense. Wagner was tied for the lead in goals, and also had the most points.

All-AMCC Second Team Honors are sophomores Lindsey Steinsdoerfer and Heather Klimuszka, earning her first selection. Freshman Kourtney Gasparovic rounded out the second team, also earning her first selection.

The third round of selections was the Honorable Mentions. Glenn Robash, Meredith Gipson and Jaclyn Stottlemeyer earned their way to honors.
