
## **OMEN'S WATER POLO Behrend drops three games during invite**

The Junker Center recently hosted the Penn-State Behrend women's water polo invitational, which included 14 games over the span of two days. This included mostly division II teams such as Mercyhurst, Gannon, Villanova, Chatham University, Utica, and Toronto.

The Behrend women opened up their invitational against Toronto University last Saturday in the third of eight games played in the Junker Center pool that day. After junior Tegan Boland and freshman MaryEllen Spooner both scored one goal apiece for the Lady Lions, the offense fell off as they fell to Toronto by a final score of 19-2.

The Blue and White were back in the pool the next morning to face off against fellow Erie school, the Gannon Golden Knights in the sec-

Mercyhurst College was the last competitor for the Lions in their second game of the day and third of the invitational. The Lakers won their first three games of the tournament against Villanova, Chatham University, and Utica before blanking the Lady Lions 5-0. Behrend fell behind early, giving up three goals in the first period, and was only able to mount nine shots on goal, all of which saved by Mercyhurst goaltender Hope Rozelle.

A positive for the women's water polo team is the potential they have coming from a strong swimming and diving program. The team has five freshmen currently on the roster and are hoping to add success to the program in the future.

"We didn't give up this weekend," said freshman Kim Ballentine. "The weekend started off rough with hard competition, but we really started to play together as a team as the weekend went on.


