Angela Rose brings sexual awareness to Behrend

On Monday, students in the Smith Chapel were confronted with an issue that has been in and out of the news throughout the United States: Sexual violence.

Angela Rose, founder of PAVE (Promoting Awareness Victim Empowerment), explained to her audience the real picture of sexual violence.

Angela, who was a victim of sexual violence herself at the age of 17, told her story and how it inspired her to make others aware of the issue.

"One in four women and one in six men will be directly affected by sexual violence before the age of 18. But the worst part is that sexual assault crimes are the most underreported crime in the U.S." said Rose.

Along with this, Angela made it clear that one of the best ways to deal with this type of situation, whether it affects you or someone you care about, is to tell your story.

"There is no shame in being a survivor."

Rose also gave statistics and hints about how to recognize someone who may be dealing with sexual assault, she also demystified the truths and myths about sexual assault, such as the myth that men do not suffer from sexual assault crimes as much as females do.

Other topics that were brought up included how to talk and deal with someone who has been sexually as-

saulted, and how to help prevent crimes like this from happening.

Elizabeth Zahar, who organized the event, explained how important it was for Behrend students to become aware of organizations like PAVE.

"You see these big name campuses in the news with reports of sexual assault and violence and you don't always hear about it around Behrend's campus," Zahar said.

Angela Rose also commented about

how important it is for college students to become aware of the issue.

"Because college students are more independent and have easier access to alcohol, it is crucial to understand what it means to give consent. The absence of a 'no' does not mean 'yes'"

The Behrend campus will soon be aware of this issue come April.

One the ways that PAVE brings awareness to the public is by the Binding Project that takes place in April,

which is sexual assault support month.

"During my kidnapping, my arms and legs were bound by zip ties. Instead of them being a reminder of what happened, I decided to use them to bring awareness of this issue," said Angela as she explained what the project involved and how it works.

During the project, participants wear zip ties that say a power word or phrase that represents a person indi-

vidually.

So far, the project has included over 100,000 participants nationwide, and Behrend organizations are thinking about bringing the project to campus.


Rose hopes that projects like the Binding Project will help victims overcome obstacles and prevent others from being victims.
