


Not convinced? Let's see what veteran defensemen, Paul Martin, has to say about the situation,

The allegations were brought to light from allegations that Cecil Newton and another man, John Bond, tried to secure payment from Mississippi State during Cam Newton's transfer from a junior college. The rumored amount was \$180,000.

Newton has proclaimed his innocence, saying "I haven't done anything wrong," during a press conference.

Still, his checkered past is not helping matters. Newton was accused of stealing a laptop computer from a Florida State student, where he started his collegiate career. Recent reports also suggest Newton would have been facing expulsion for cheating three times during his short tenure at Florida State. After last week's victory, Auburn Coach, Gene Chizik, discussed Newton: "Let me tell you something. This is
