The story of Joan of Arc centers around the highlights and crises of a nineteen year old girl on the road to martyrdom. As Shaw presents Joan, she is not only a gentle and pious girl, but a brilliant military strategist who led the French army to victory in the Hundred Years War. So long as men and women fight for their country's freedom, Joan of Arc will be remembered just as she is in Shaw's play, the saint of all soldiers.
