

Parking Lot Regulations

Much to the delight of car driving students, the new parking lot F, opened Wednesday, November 17, behind Dobbins Hall. This parking lot is restricted to long term parking of resident hall students and guests. Because there are no lights, security will be carefully patrolling the area.

The small parking lots behind the individual dorms will be used by the dorm resident staff and also for short term parking of resident students and their guests.

Lot A, which is located next to the Reed Union Building, is for faculty, staff, visitors and commuters.

These restrictions will be enforced starting Monday, November 22.
